KEYWORDS/PHRASES AND MEANINGS

Democracy- form of government in which the common people hold political power and can rule either directly or through elected representatives.

Voting- to cast or conduct a vote. (by choosing your preferred candidate on a ballot paper.)

Representation- how something is shown eg, the makeup of Parliament through different groups in society we can see how well represented people are.

Parliament- Parliament is the legislature or lawmaking group in the government **Left wing**- believe in an equal society and believe that the government should play a large part in people's lives in order to achieve this.

Right wing- believe that a certain level of social inequality is unavoidable, and that the government should play a limited role in people's lives.




THINGS A BRIGHT GIRL CAN DO

A heartbreaking and powerful story about a black boy killed by a white police officer, drawing connections with real-life history, from the author Jewell Parker Rhodes.



THE AMOUNT OF CONTROL OR INFLUENCE SOMEBODY HAS.



THE AMOUNT OF RIGHT, IMMUNITY, OR BENEFIT ENJOYED BY A PARTICULAR PERSON.

OPPRESSION

THE AMOUNT OF PROLONGED CRUEL OR UNJUST TREATMENT OR EXERCISE OF AUTHORITY.

Intersectional feminism centres the voices of those experiencing overlapping forms of oppression. It recognises that we are made up of multiple identities, and the oppression we may experience reflects that.

Types of prejudice such as sexism or racism do not always exist in isolation, but often combine to form a new type of oppression.

Intersectionality, therefore, illuminates the overlaps between inequalities and gives us a more accurate understanding of the world we live in today.

GINA MARTIN' S STORY

WHO IS GINA MARTIN?

SHE IS A WRITER, BROADCASTER AND CAMPAIGNER. SHE IS AN AMBASSADOR FOR UN WOMENUK.AND SHE IS AN ORDINARY PERSON THAT MADE CHANGE AFTER SHE FELT INJUSTICE. FROM GENDER EQUALITY, WHITE PRIVILEGE TO HUMAN RIGHTS. SHE "WANTS TO MAKE POLITICS AND THE CONVERSATION AROUND IT MORE ACCESSIBLE TO PEOPLE BECAUSE IT'S SO COMPLEX AND GATEKEPT."

GINA ISN'T A POLITICIAN, SHE ISN'T IN THE CABINET OR HOUSE OF LORDS, SHE ISN'T A LAWYER, AND SHE DOESN'T OWN A FUNNY WIG AND YET SHE CHANGED THE LAW!

WHAT MADE HER WANT TO CHANGE SOMETHING?

GINA WAS AT A FESTIVAL WHEN A MAN TOOK PHOTOS UP HER SKIRT IN BROAD DAYLIGHT AND SHE GRABBED THE PERPETRATORS PHONE AND RAN UP TO SECURITY AUTHORITIES. THE POLICE WERE CALLED BUT THEY TOLD GINA THAT NOTHING WOULD COME OUT OF HER OFFICIAL COMPLAINT BECAUSE UPSKIRTING, THE PRACTICE OF TAKING NON-CONSENSUAL SEXUAL PHOTOS OF SOMEONE, WAS NOT ILLEGAL.

HOW DID SHE GO ABOUT IT?

A FEW DAYS AFTER THE INCIDENT SHE WROTE ABOUT WHAT HAD HAPPENED ON FACEBOOK. HER POST WENT VIRAL WITH OTHER WOMEN SHARING SIMILAR EXPERIENCES.SOON AN ONLINE PETITION CALLING FOR POLICE TO REOPEN THE CASE HAD RECEIVED 50,000 SIGNATURES. THE BILL WAS INITIALLY BLOCKED BY A TORY BACKBENCH MP. HOWEVER IT SECURED GOVERNMENT BACKING. THE NEW LEGISLATION WAS APPROVED IN THE HOUSE OF LORDS AND PASSED THE FORMALITY OF ROYAL ASSENT TO BECOME LAW.

DEMOCRACY EXPLAINED







HOUSE OF COMMONS

MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT (MPS) ARE ELECTED EVERY FIVE YEARS AT A GENERAL ELECTION.
THERE ARE 650 LOCAL AREAS EACH WITH ONE MP.
MP'S JOB IS TO REPRESENT THEIR AREA AND HELP MAKE LAW/ SCRUTINISE THE

GOVERNMENT.

HOUSE OF LORDS

THE HOUSE OF LORDS IS THE SECOND CHAMBER OF THE UK PARLIAMENT. THE ROLE OF THE HOUSE OF LORDS IS TO HELP MAKE LAWS AS WELL AS CHECK-ON THE WORK OF GOVERNMENT AND INVESTIGATE ISSUES. MOST PEERS HAVE BEEN APPOINTED BY THE QUEEN ON THE ADVICE OF A PRIME MINISTER IN RECOGNITION OF THEIR EXPERTISE IN A PARTICULAR AREA.

THE MONARCHY

THE UK'S POLITICAL
SYSTEM CAN BE DESCRIBED
AS A CONSTITUTIONAL
MONARCHY WITH A KING
OR QUEEN AS HEAD OF
STATE.HOWEVER, IT IS THE
HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT
THAT MAKE OUR LAWS,
NOT THE MONARCH. THE
MONARCH ONLY FORMALLY
PASSES LEGISLATION THIS IS KNOWN AS ROYAL
ASSENT.

WHAT IS A POLITICAL PARTY?

A POLITICAL PARTY IS A GROUP OF PEOPLE WITH SIMILAR IDEAS AND BELIEFS WHO HAVE COME TOGETHER TO WORK TO ACHIEVE THEIR AIMS. THE IDEAS OF A POLITICAL PARTY ARE WRITTEN DOWN IN A DOCUMENT CALLED A MANIFESTO. THE PARTY MANIFESTO PROVIDES THE BASIS FOR ACTION SHOULD A PARTY WIN AN ELECTION.

WHAT ARE SOME EXAMPLES OF

POLITICAL PARTIES?
THERE ARE SEVERAL DIFFERENT PARTIES IN
THE UK EACH WITH DIFFERENT IDEAS AND
POLICIES. THE LARGEST PARTIES INCLUDE
THE CONSERVATIVE PARTY, THE LABOUR
PARTY, THE LIBERAL DEMOCRAT PARTY,UKIP
AND IN SCOTLAND, THE SCOTTISH NATIONAL
PARTY. THERE ARE OTHER SMALLER PARTIES
SUCH AS THE GREEN PARTY AND PLAID CYMRU
TO NAME A FEW.

NOT EVERYONE ALWAYS HAD THE RIGHT TO VOTE. IN 1918, THE REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE ACT GAVE THE VOTE TO MEN OVER THE AGE OF 21, AND TO WOMEN OVER THE AGE OF 30.

WHAT IS AN MP?

AN MP IS AN ELECTED MEMBER OF PARLIAMENT THAT PEOPLE CHOOSE TO REPRESENT THEM THROUGH AN ELECTION.

HOW DO I FIND MY MP?

WHEREEVER YOU MAY LIVE YOU WILL HAVE AN MP THAT REPRESENTS YOU! FINDING YOUR MP IS SUPER SIMPLE. JUST HEAD TO THIS WEBSITE AND TYPE IN YOUR AREA. HTTPS://MEMBERS.PARLIAME NT.UK/FINDYOURMP

WHAT DOES AN MP DO?

THEY PARTICIPATE IN DEBATES AND VOTING ON LEGISLATION. THEY MAY ALSO BE MEMBERS OF COMMITTEES EXAMINING **NEW LAWS OR THE** WORK OF GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS. THEY ARE ALSO THERE TO VOICE THEIR CONCERNS.

THE CABINET

WHAT IS THE CABINET?

THE CABINET IS THE TEAM OF 20 OR SO MOST SENIOR MINISTERS IN THE GOVERNMENT THAT LEADS ON SPECIFIC POLICY AREAS SUCH AS HEALTH, TRANSPORT, FOREIGN AFFAIRS OR DEFENCE.

WHO CHOOSES THE **CABINET?**

THE CABINET IS CHOSEN BY THE PRIME MINISTER.

HOUSE OF COMMONS

MEMBERS OF YOUTH PARLIAMENT AGED 1118 TAKE PART IN AN ANNUAL DEBATE IN
THE HOUSE OF COMMONS CHAMBER,
CHAIRED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE
OF COMMONS RT HON LINDSEY HOYLE MP.
THEY DEBATE FIVE ISSUES CHOSEN BY A
BALLOT OF YOUNG PEOPLE FROM ACROSS
THE UK AND THEN VOTE TO DECIDE WHICH
TWO ISSUES SHOULD BECOME THE UK
YOUTH PARLIAMENT'S PRIORITY
CAMPAIGNS FOR THE YEAR AHEAD.






YOUTH FOCUS NORTH WEST

YOUTH FOCUS NORTH WEST IS A STRATEGIC HUB FOR YOUTH WORK, SUPPORTING AND RUNNING MANY YOUNG PEOPLE LED PROJECTS ACROSS THE NORTH WEST.

"WE LIKE TO MAKE THINGS HAPPEN AND OUR BELIEF IN YOUNG PEOPLE, LISTENING TO THEIR VOICES AND MOVING FROM VOICE TO POWER UNDERPINS EVERYTHING."



WHAT DOES YOUTHFORIA DO?

This North West Youth Forum involves young people who are part of democratic representation structures from all 23 North West local authorities and all Members of the UK Youth Parliament. Focused on issues of social justice and improving the lives of their peers Youthforia members take their messages and campaigns to decision makers and politicians locally, regionally and nationally.



WHO ARE THE STEERING GROUP?

YOUTHFORIA MEETINGS ARE RUN BY YOUNG PEOPLE FOR YOUNG PEOPLE. THE SG ARE ELECTED YOUNG PEOPLE FROM 16-18 AT YOUTHFORIA WHO HELP ORGANISE AND FACILIATE YOUTHFORIA MEETINGS. THERE ARE USUALLY 12-13 STEERING GROUP REPRESENTATIVES.



REPRESENTATION



THE HOUSE OF COMMONS IS AN ELECTED BODY CONSISTING OF 650 MEMBERS KNOWN AS MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT (MPS). MPS ARE ELECTED TO REPRESENT CONSTITUENCIES BY THE FIRST-PAST-THE-POST SYSTEM. HERE IS A SMALL BREAKDOWN OF HOW WELL THE UK IS REPRESENTED.

1 WOMAN

A TOTAL OF 220 OF MP'S ARE FEMALE.
THIS IS 34%.

LGBTQ+

AMONG THE 650 MPS THERE ARE AT LEAST 45 WHO ARE OPENLY GAY, LESBIAN OR BISEXUAL THE SCOTTISH NATIONAL PARTY HAS THE HIGHEST PROPORTION, WITH NINE OF ITS 47 MPS OPENLY GAY.

WHY IS REPRESENTATION IMPORTANT?

IF THE SYSTEM IS MEANT TO BE A REPRESENTATIVE DEMOCRACY,
THEN IT SHOULD BE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MANY POPULATIONS IT SERVES, AND THAT INCLUDES PEOPLE OF ALL IDENTITIES.

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VOTING SYSTEMS

FIRST-PAST-THE-POST

MOST VOTES WINS.

THE HOUSE OF COMMONS AND LOCAL COUNCILS IN ENGLAND AND WALES USE THE FIRST
PAST-THE-POST SYSTEM.

AT A GENERAL OR LOCAL
ELECTION, VOTERS PUT A CROSS
(X) NEXT TO THEIR PREFERRED
CANDIDATE ON A BALLOT PAPER.
BALLOT PAPERS ARE COUNTED.
THE CANDIDATE WITH THE MOST
VOTES REPRESENTS THE
CONSTITUENCY OR AREA.

SINGLE TRANSFERABLE VOTE (STV)

USING PREFERENCES AND QUOTA.

USED FOR DEPUTY SPEAKER IN HOUSE OF COMMONS, LOCAL ELECTIONS IN SCOTLAND AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND MORE.

VOTERS RANK CANDIDATES IN ORDER OF PREFERENCE.

EACH CANDIDATE NEEDS TO REACH A QUOTA.

THE FIRST PREFERENCE VOTES FOR EACH
CANDIDATE ARE ADDED UP. CANDIDATES WHO
ACHIEVE THIS QUOTA ARE ELECTED.
SURPLUS VOTES FROM CANDIDATES WHO HIT
THE QUOTA GO TO SECOND PREFERENCE
CANDIDATES.

ALTERNATIVE VOTE (AV)

"PREFERENTIAL" VOTING
SYSTEM

USED FOT THE CHAIRS OF MOST COMMITTEES AND THE LORD SPEAKER.

VOTERS RANK CANDIDATES IN ORDER OF PREFERENCE BY MARKING 1, 2, 3 AND SO ON. A VOTER CAN RANK AS MANY OR AS FEW CANDIDATES AS THEY LIKE OR VOTE FOR ONE CANDIDATE.

FIRST PREFENCE VOTES ARE COUNTED FIRST, THEY NEED 50% OF VOTES TO WIN. IF THERE IS NO MAJORITY THE CANDIATE WITH THE LEAST AMOUNT OF VOTES IS ELIMINATED AND THEIR SECOND PREFERENCE VOTES ARE REALLOCATED TO THE REMAINING CANDIDATES. IF ONE CANDIDATE HAS MORE VOTES THAN THE OTHER REMAINING CANDIDATES PUT TOGETHER, THAT CANDIDATE IS ELECTED.

CLOSED PARTY LIST

USED BY ENGLAND, SCOTLAND AND WALES TO ELECT MEMBERS OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT.

A VOTER MARKS A CROSS ON THE BALLOT
PAPER NEXT TO THE PARTY'S NAME. PARTIES
GET THE NUMBER OF SEATS IN PROPORTION TO
THE VOTES IT RECEIVES IN EACH
CONSTITUENCY.

VOTERS CHOOSE PARTIES NOT CANDIDATES.
THE PARTIES DETERMINE THE ORDER IN WHICH
CANDIDATES APPEAR ON THE LIST.
