

## Club Safeguarding Notice Board (Suggested)

At our club, everyone has the right to feel safe, respected, and supported.

Here's what good safeguarding practice looks like for children, young people, and adults who are part of our club community.

### Welcoming Environment

- Staff and volunteers are approachable, friendly, and clearly identifiable (e.g., badges or club kit).
- Everyone is treated with respect and dignity.
- Behaviour that makes others feel uncomfortable, unsafe, or excluded is not tolerated.

### Keeping Everyone Safe

- Activities are well supervised, with staff following club policies and safe practice guidance.
- Areas used by children and young people are kept clean, safe, and appropriate.
- Staff and volunteers never work alone and out of sight with a child or young person.

### Listening and Taking Concerns Seriously

- Children, young people, and adults are encouraged to speak up if something doesn't feel right.
- Any worry, big or small, is taken seriously, recorded, and acted on promptly.
- We never ignore or dismiss concerns.

### Safe Relationships & Boundaries

- Staff and volunteers maintain professional boundaries at all times.
- No private messaging or direct/secret contact with young people.
- Physical contact is not permitted.

### Clear Policies and Trained Staff

- The club follows current safeguarding policies and procedures set out by Lancashire Cricket Foundation and ECB.
- All safeguarding officers, staff, and volunteers complete regular safeguarding training.
- Risk assessments are in place for activities, equipment, and the club environment.
